Very little architecture was happening at that time, which was challenging. Adding to that, we didn't have experience in developing a business. With our experience in developing projects though, we knew that if we reached out to others, they would reach back out to us when needed, giving us the connections we'd need to start building ALINE as a business.

One of our first steps was meeting with our mentors and architects we respected highly in the industry. We asked them all the same question: "What was successful and what failed?" Hearing those responses helped us focus the business on our strengths, helped us build a strong network, and constantly reevaluate our progress and goals.

Leaning on their experience and guidance helped us make educated business choices and continues to lead ALINE's growth today.
